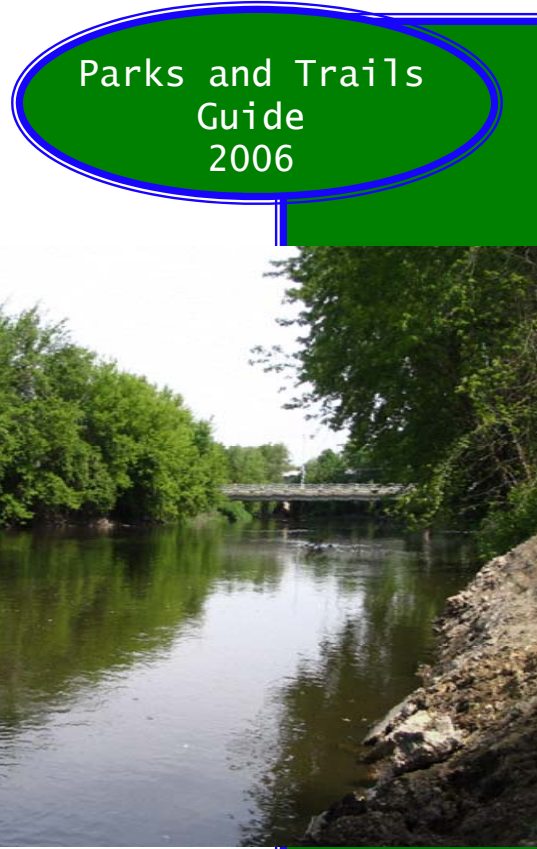

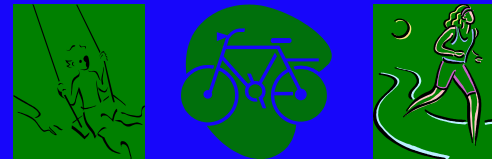

Parks and Trails

The City of Delano is dedicated to its Parks and Trails and has made strides toward developing a comprehensive system to better serve the residents of the town. Get out and explore all that Delano has to offer! Delano Parks and Trails: find your pathway to a healthier lifestyle, a refreshing afternoon and magnificent scenery.



The City of Delano is home to 12 Neighborhood Parks, 2 Specialty Parks and over 15 Miles of Trails and Sidewalks. All of these come together to offer locals a unique recreational experience. Residents enjoy opportunities such as a Skate Park, BMX track and creative play structures. Neighborhood parks give residents an opportunity to get outside and enjoy the great Minnesota seasons and foster a sense of community .



Regional Parks

Delano benefits from two regional parks which service the town. Central Park and Lake Rebecca Park Reserve offer large open green spaces, picnic areas and substantial play areas. Central Park is home to Delano's Fourth of July Celebration, as well as the Delano A's town baseball team. Four baseball/softball fields are also available along with two shelters. Lake Rebecca offers all of the benefits of a park reserve including a lake and numerous trails. Delano's Park and Trail system, when coupled with Lake Rebecca Park Reserve offers a recreational outlet for all.

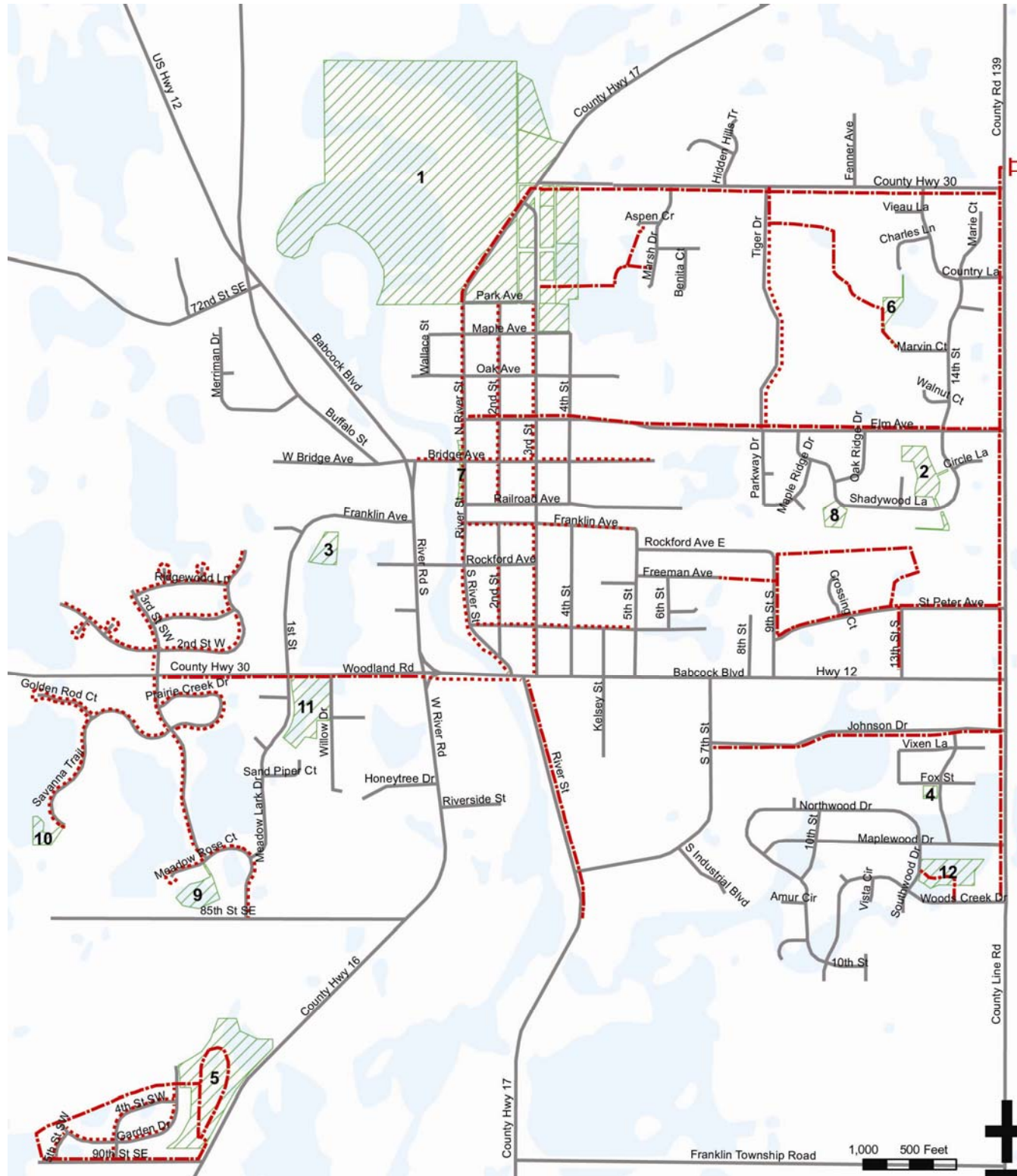

Map Key

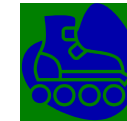
- 1) **Central Park**- Amenities include: greenspace, band shell, grandstand, baseball field, softball fields and play areas.
- 2) **County Line Park**- Amenities include: creative play area and greenspace.
- 3) **Krienke Park**- Amenities include: open greenspace and a creative play area.
- 4) **Maple Knoll Park**- Amenities include: creative play structure and swings.
- 5) **Parkview Hills Park**- Amenities include: creative play area, ball fields, trails and picnic area.
- 6) **Rebecca Park Estates Park**- Amenities include: walking path to school and greenspace.
- 7) **River Front Park**- Amenities include: sidewalks, benches, decorative clock and gardens.
- 8) **Stahlke Park**- Amenities include: ice rink, swings, merry-go-round and climbing structures.
- 9) **Westridge Hills Park**- Amenities include: sidewalk trails and a creative play area.
- 10) **Westridge Park**- Amenities include: Gazebo, nature trail and open space views.
- 11) **Woodland Meadows Park**- Amenities include: backstop, ice rink, greenspace and a creative play area.
- 12) **Woods Creek Park**- Amenities include: tennis court, basketball court, climbing structure, hockey rink, and volleyball court.
